THERE WAS A TIME when cinemas used to serve up the dessert before the main course. Mickey Mouse or Laurel and Hardy and even the abstract form-based games of Oskar Fischinger would leave the audiences enraptured even when the feature films which followed proved boring. At a time in which cinema was prepared to be a source of culture, in the 1920s and early 1930s, short film were quite simply an integral element.

Today, with more than two thousand productions, Germany is the India of short film. Welcome to Bollywood. And the medium has again developed into the diversity of its early days: Fiction films, experimental, music or documentaries - all are now being presented in the short form. And even the loathed calling card films of future commercial feature films also repeatedly demonstrate a feeling for the specifics of the medium: The value of the single shot in a dramatic setting which cannot afford too much.

We are proud that this year's Spotlight of the Worldwide Short Film Festival is shining on Germany to show the rich and widely differentiated German short film scene.






